- Students need to gain 60 ECTS (120 SCQF) credits while abroad

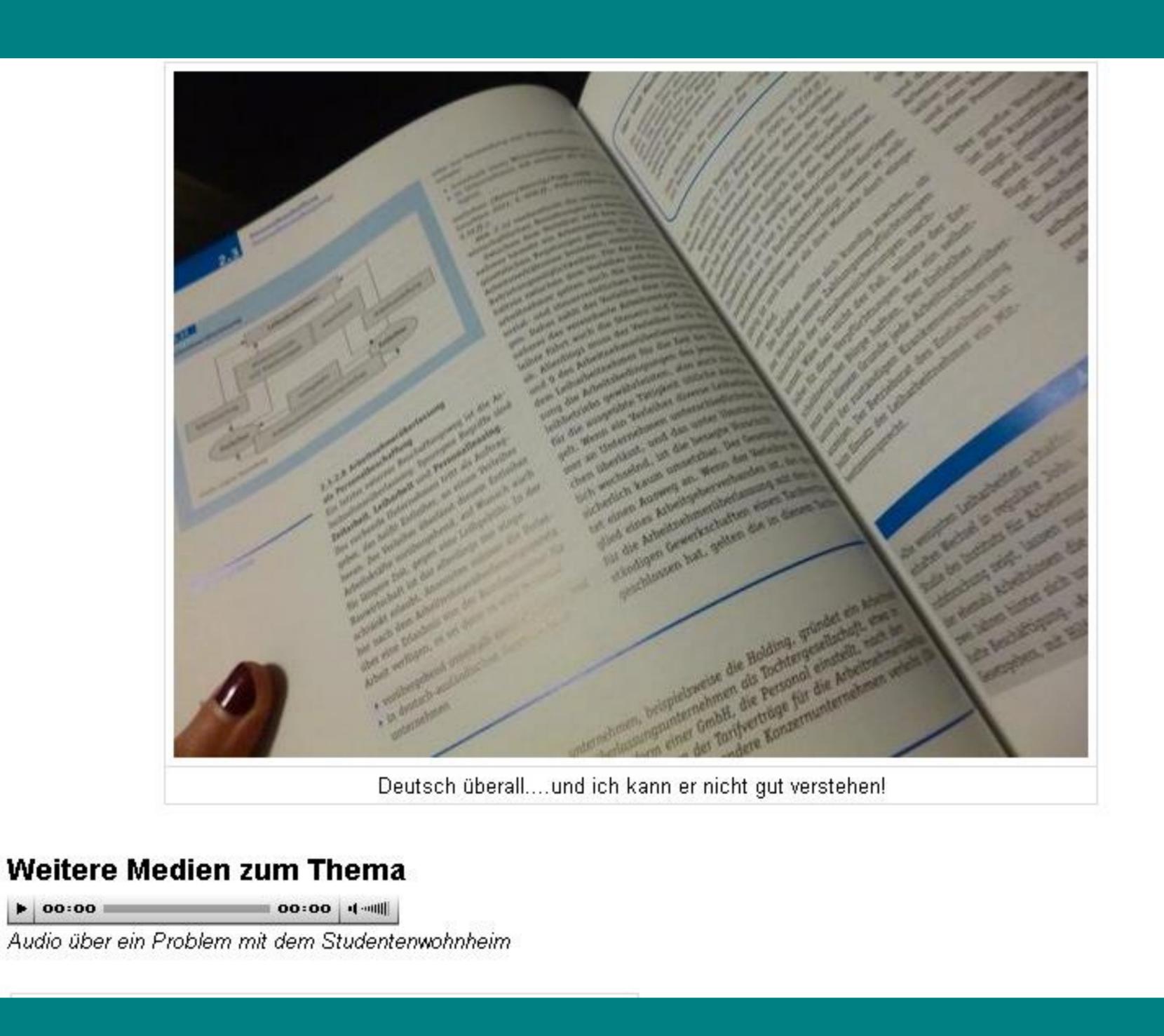




Why we developed this module

1. Where can I go?

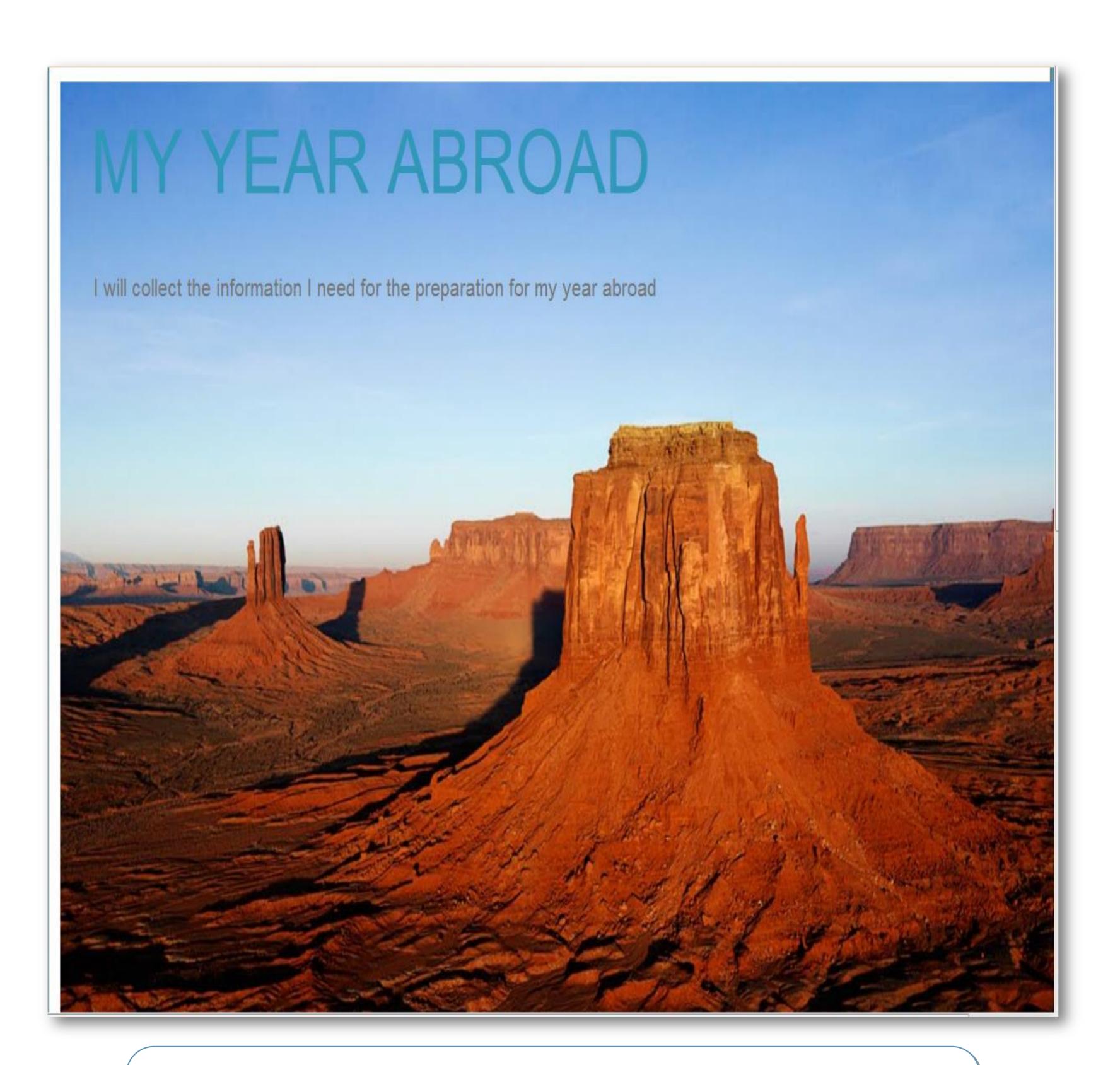
It is paramount that it has been agreed with your Programme leader that you are allowed to go abroad and study for the second semester as part of your Programme of Studies.

You can choose to go to an institution of an European Union country where there is a signed Erasmus agreement with Edinburgh Napier University and where there is a suitable Programme of studies.

You can also choose to go and study in the **United States** or **Canada.** To go to the US, you will need to be registered on to the **ISEP Programme**. 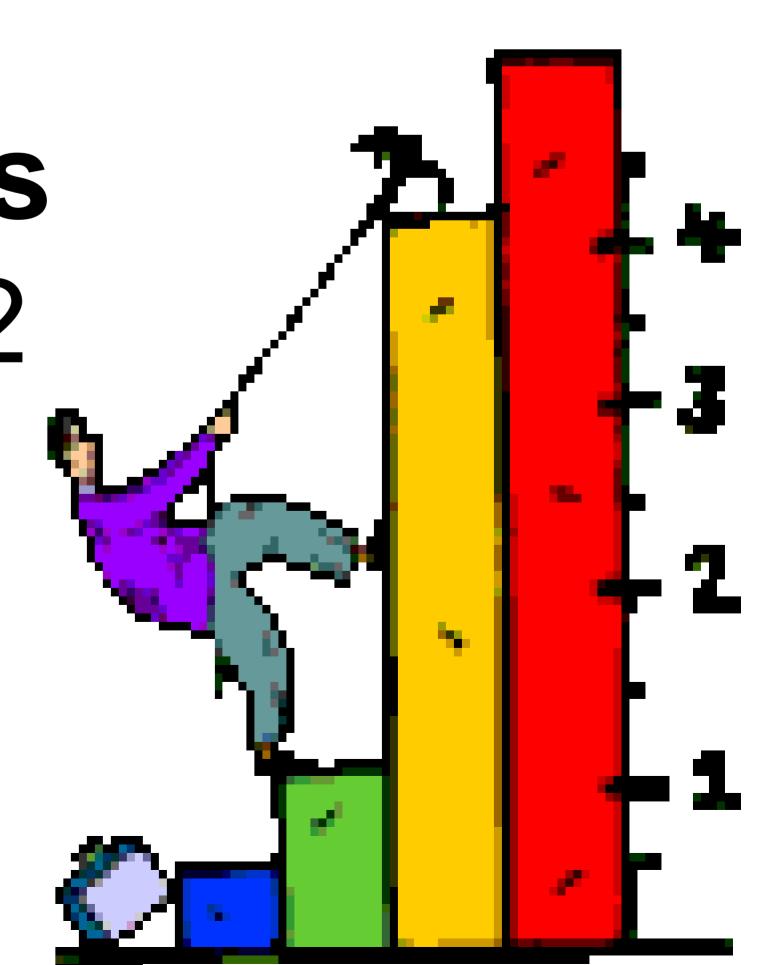

PLAN OF ACTION

- 5 specific actions before you go
- 3 specific challenges you have identified:
 - what actions are you going to take to achieve them?
 - what actions are you going to take if you get into difficulty?



Assessment

"The type of assessment used influences styles of learning" (Brown et al, 1997)

LOs predominantly concerned with reflection and personal development

E-portfolios foster the use of creativity and encourage reflection on learning (Biggs 2007)



ASSESSMENT TASKS FOR SEMESTER 1:

- 1. Essay on "Cultural Shock"
- 2. Information research:
- a. Summary of country specific information about the area and institution of the destination
- b. Quiz: series of practical questions related to the destination.
- 3. Identification of 5/6 topics of current affairs in the destination country



ASSESSMENT TASKS FOR SEMESTER 2 (while abroad)

1. REFLECTIVE REPORTAGE

The Reflective Reportage should include the following:

- a. Reflection on Personal Development
- b. Reflection on Academic Development
- c. Analysis of 2 critical incidents

Illustration should be given using different media sources (at least 3 media sources)



2. ANALYSIS OF 2 CHOSEN CURRENT AFFAIRS

The analysis should:

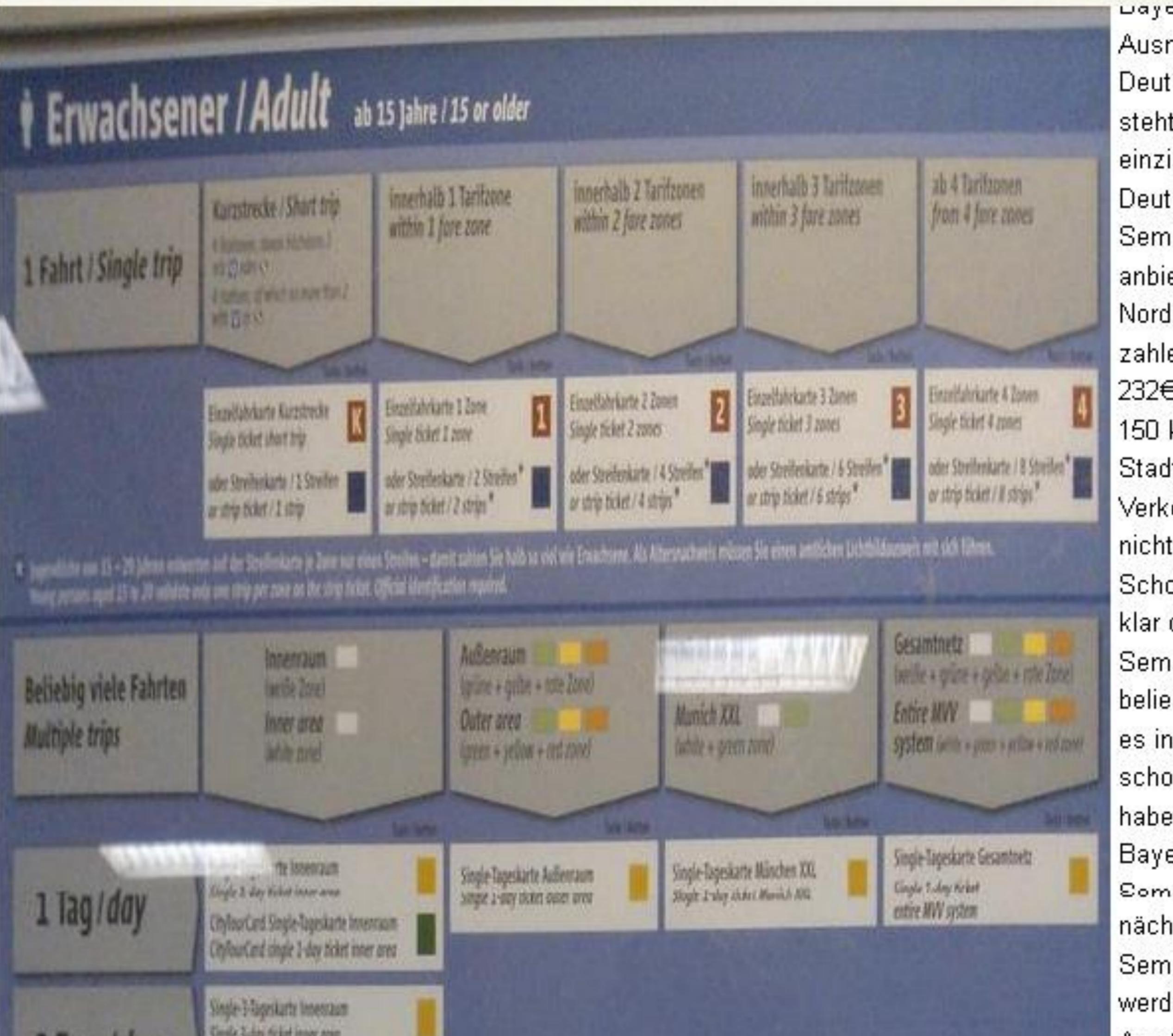
- Show the development of each topic overtime
- Compare and contrast different sources (all referenced)
- Be supported by statements with quotes, citations
- Be properly written with clear articulation and within the word count.



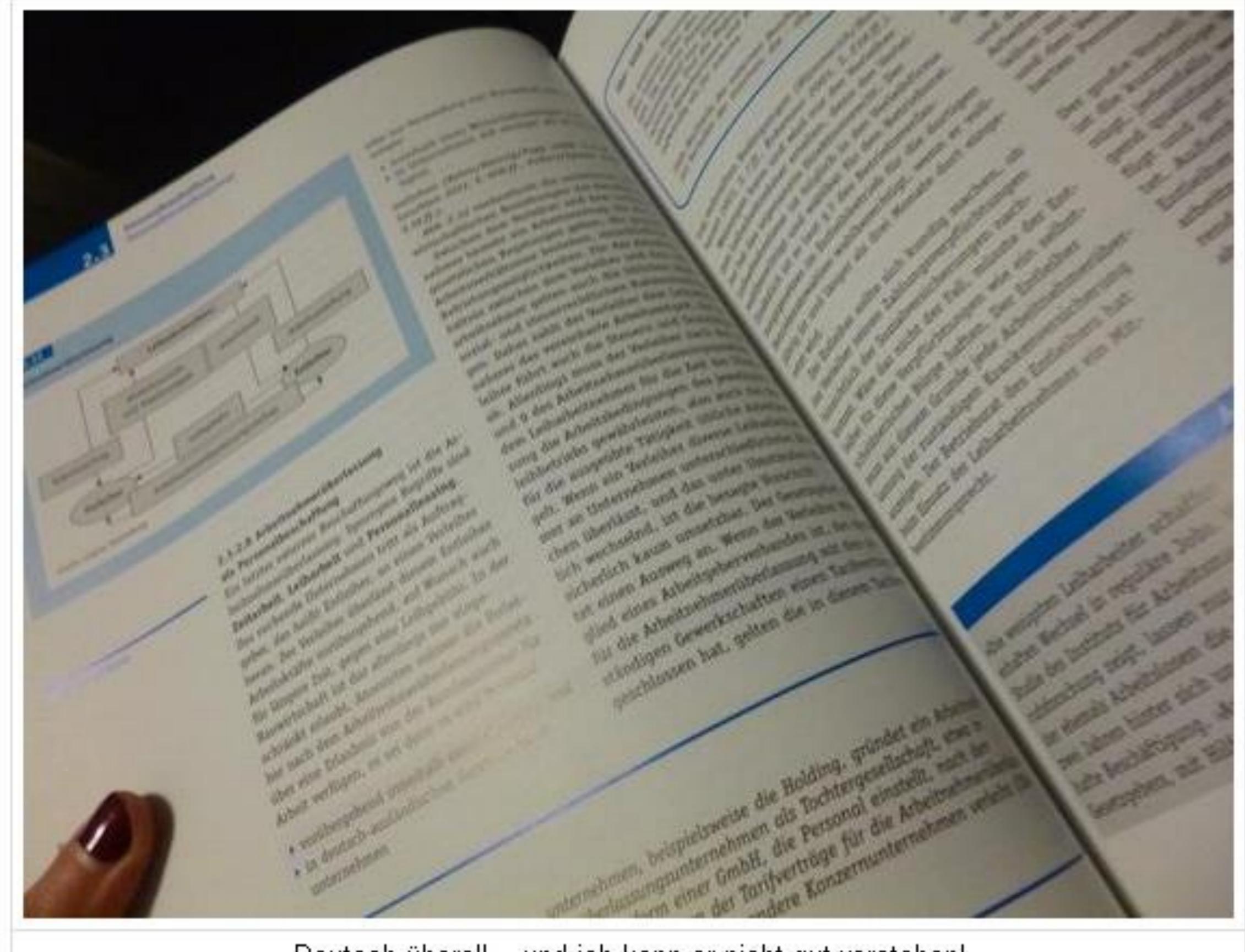
Assessment tasks include

- traditional (essay, quiz) and innovative (multimedia journal) elements,
- authentic assessments (information gathering)
- declarative (quiz) and reflective (essay, journal) elements
- formative and summative elements (current affairs)
- sustainable learning (journal)



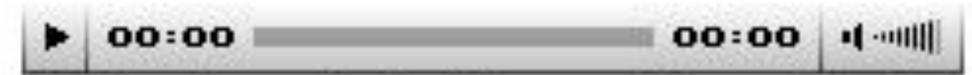

- Language is still unresolved





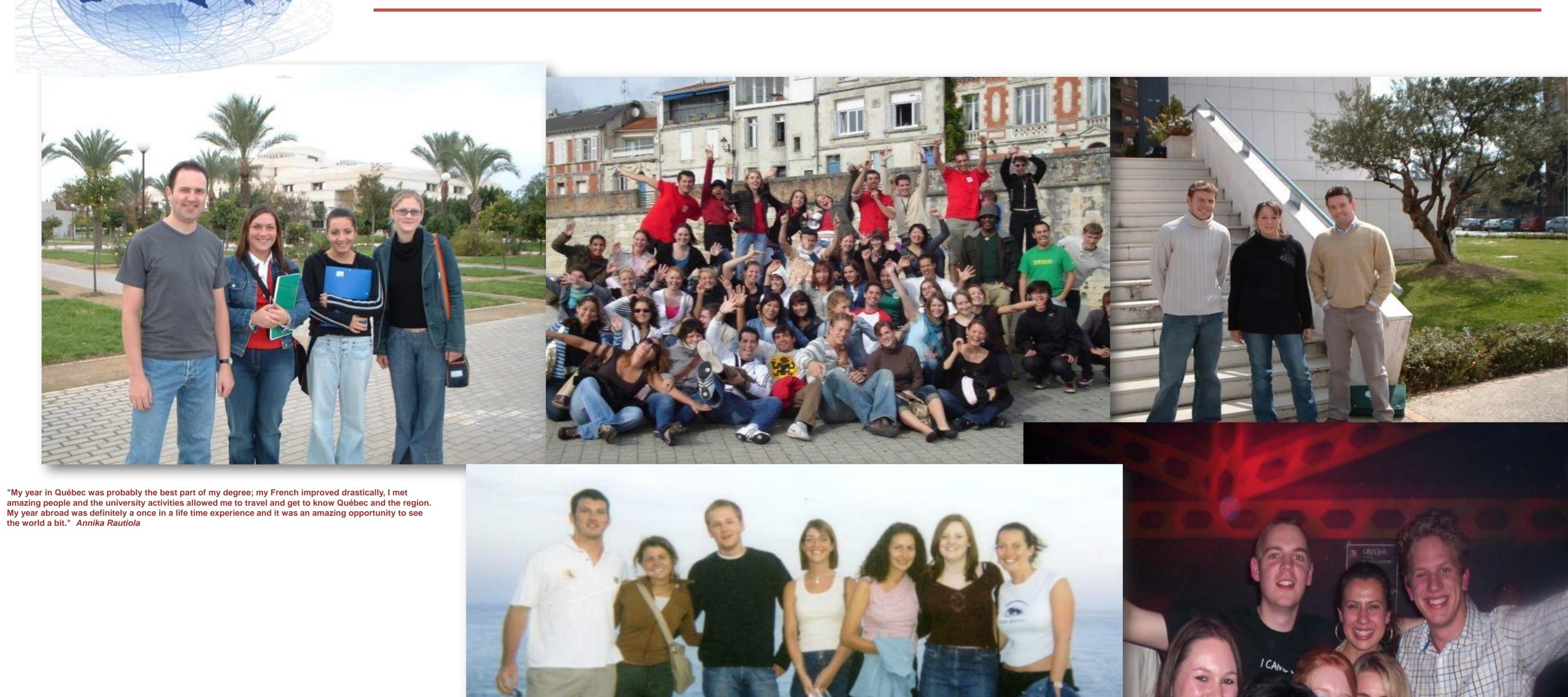
Concluding Remarks
